Raritan Valley Habitat for Humanity_builds permanent affordable housing for low-income families by mobilizing a cooperative volunteer effort. RVHFH and community volunteers find the site, raise the funds, and select a family for each new home. The selected family works side-by-side with RVHFH and community volunteers on the construction of their new home. The family purchases the home upon completion with the help of a low-interest, no-down payment mortgage provided by Raritan Valley Habitat for Humanity. We recycle mortgage payments to fund the construction of more houses. Pantry Locations and Other Food Resources

Pantries provide perishable and non-perishable foods, including dairy products, fresh fruits and vegetables, baked goods, canned goods, dried goods, frozen meats, and more, based on availability. Many agencies provide a variety of non-food options such as personal care items, paper products, etc. Pantries are largely distributing these items in a pre-packaged form. NOTE: A valid ID and a piece of mail verifying your address within Somerset County may be required. Visit the pantry website or call the number listed to confirm what they require.

The **Food Bank of Somerset County** helps individuals and families in need. All services are entirely free and available without referrals from other social agencies or providers. Names or other information is not reported to any Government Agency.

Foods of all types is available (including fresh, frozen, and refrigerated), along with personal care items, and cleaning supplies. You can get help right away on your first visit. You may call ahead if you have questions, but it isn't necessary. <u>https://www.somersetfoodbank.org/</u>

Smoke Detector Check for seniors and others. The North Plainfield Fire Department will check the operation and location of smoke detectors, as well as yearly replacement of their batteries, for all senior citizens in the Borough. Each year around Fire Prevention Week the department visits all of the senior citizens on a running list. If you are a senior and interested in this program, please call fire headquarters at 908-769-2935.

Good Morning Program is designed to assist senior citizens in having regular daily contact with the North Plainfield Police Department ensuring that the senior is fine. As a Good Morning Program participant, the resident must call the North Plainfield Police Department each morning to say that they are well. If no call is made by the participant, the North Plainfield Police Department will call their residence to speak with the participant. If no answer is received, a police officer will be sent to check on them.

This program allows family, friends or neighbors the security of knowing that the participant is having regular daily contact. For more information contact: Detective Sergeant Albert Domizi at **908 769-2937**.

The Somerset County Handyman Program was created to provide support services to enhance the quality of life for seniors and physically disabled citizens of the County. This program utilizes the skills and talents of local volunteers. Do you need help at home with a small repair? Plumbing? Electric? To be eligible for the service you must be: A senior citizen or disabled resident of Somerset County or the family of active duty military, unable to do the repair or task yourself or unable to find a contractor to do the small job. Clients are expected to pay for supplies but the volunteer labor is free. Donations are accepted to help defray the costs of the program and to help pay for supplies for those who cannot afford to pay. The Wheelchair Ramp Policy can be seen <u>here</u>. Friends of The Carpenter program assists low and moderate income residents in the repair of unsafe conditions in their homes. The grant is provided in the form of an interest-free loan which is forgiven over a period of ten years. Each year you continue to own and live in your home or condo, 10% of the loan is forgiven. New Jersey Lifeline for Seniors and Disabled Adults is a \$225 yearly electric or gas bill credit for seniors or disabled adults in New Jersey. To qualify, you must be a New Jersey resident, 65 years of age or older, or 18 years of age or older and receiving Social Security Title II Disability benefits. Your personal annual income (not the household income), cannot exceed \$42,142 if single or \$49,209 if married.
