**RESOLUTION NO. 10-22-18-01c** RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND BOROUGH CLERK TO EXECUTE A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH GROTTO ENGINEERING ASSOCIATES, LLC FOR THE PREPARATION OF BID SPECIFICATIONS AND SUPPORT FOR THE 2019-2020 EMERGENCY ONCALL REPAIR CONTRACT FOR THE BOROUGH OF NORTH PLAINFIELD

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield is in need of a Professional Engineer to prepare bid specifications and support for the 2019-2020 emergency on-call repair services contract (hereinafter referred to as the "Project"); and,

WHEREAS, Grotto Engineering Associates, LLC, with its principal place of business located at 340 North Avenue, Cranford, New Jersey 07016, is in the business of providing Professional Engineering services and previously submitted a proposal for the Project for the Borough of North Plainfield, Somerset County, New Jersey, dated October 8, 2018, in an amount of Two Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$2,200.00) per set of bid specifications; and,
