The following is a report of the activities of the North Plainfield Police Department for the month. The Divisions of the Department divide the report.

ADMINISTRATION:

Staffing:

The Police Department is operating below its authorized strength of 48 sworn Officers, and 6 fulltime civilian personnel. Staffing and deficiencies:

- 3 police officers
- 1 Lieutenant's position
- 2 administrative assistants (chief and records) have been reduced to 29 hour parttime positions.

Community Outreach

The Community Policing Unit did a recent Immigrant Presentation at the North Plainfield Library for the English as a Second Language Class. Detective Domizi also conducted tours of the police building for Somerset School students showing them all areas of the building and letting them sit in the interview rooms while other students watched them through the video monitoring system and one way glass. Operation Good Morning for area Senior Citizens continues to grow in numbers and the community policing unit made 12 calls to the seniors to speak with them. 51 false alarm first notices went out in January and 3 warnings went out to repeat offenders.

Narcotics Strike Force

Officer Kropewnicki was again appointed as the agency representative for the Narcotics Strike Force for 2016. During January the members of the Strike Force spent approximately 37 man hours in the Borough conducting surveillance and interviewing people for prospective leads on narcotics investigations.

Other Matters

Members of the Detective Bureau conducted 6 background investigations during January for the following reasons; 2 taxi license investigations, 2 firearms investigations, 1 new employee investigation and 1 vendor investigation.

Detective Segeda, a department unarmed self-defense instructor for the department, completed a class titled, "Gracie Survival Tactics."

Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

On January 29, 2016 Franklin Calderon Nunez was sentenced to one year in prison for attempting to disarm one of our officers while attempting to arrest a person he was with. This sentence was issued by the Honorable Judge Reed in Somerset County Superior Court.

We are required by the Rules of Court to include herein a statement explaining that the charges are merely an accusation and that the defendants are presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
