CID Monthly Report

A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On Sunday September 1, 2019 at approximately 7:30 PM, police responded to a residence on Mountain Ave after the resident reported a package theft in progress. On arrival, police spoke to the resident who said a male had walked onto his porch and stole several delivered packages before fleeing in a black Mercedes. The resident was able to provide police with the license plate which aided in the investigation. Detectives were able to identify a subject known to operate the vehicle but was not the registered owner. A line up was presented to the resident by detectives and he positively identified the package thief. The suspect, a 24 year old Keasbey NJ resident was charged with theft and a summons was issued. The matter has been set for trial.

On Thursday September 12, 2019 at approximately 8:00 PM, police were called to a Jackson Ave address on the report of several subjects fighting in the roadway. Police separated the group and determined that it was actually a robbery that had turned into a fight. The victim and two suspects were transported to the police department for further investigation. The victim reported that he was walking down the street when he was struck from behind with an unknown object and fell to the ground. Two males then went through his pockets removing a cell phone and undetermined amount of cash. The victim was able to grab hold of one of the suspects until police arrived. The two suspects later

admitted to the robbery when they were interviewed by detectives. The Somerset County Prosecutor's Office authorized 2nd degree robbery charges on both male suspects and they were lodged in the Somerset Jail pending trial.

On September 19, 2019 at approximately 1:30 AM, police were dispatched to the area of West End Ave & Greenbrook Road on the report of two males acting suspiciously. On arrival, officers had detained the two subjects whom were wearing all dark clothing and carrying backpacks. Officers conducted a canvas of the area and discovered that several vehicles in the immediate area had been burglarized. It was later determined that the suspects were carrying stolen items from the burglarized vehicles in their backpacks. The suspects were later interviewed by detectives and were subsequently charged with several counts of 3rd degree burglary. The suspects were lodged in the Somerset County Jail awaiting a hearing.

Community Outreach

The Community Policing unit made twenty-one (21) calls to the senior citizens enrolled in the Good Morning program, and sent out nineteen (19) first time false alarm activation notices and seven (7) false alarm warnings. Det. Domizi assisted in numerous translations for both patrol & CID. Det. Domizi attended a Safety Presentation for seniors held at St.

Luke's that was held on September 9th. Det. Domizi also attended a Community Forum meeting on September 12th as well as a Fall Festival meeting on September 24th. Det. Fowler began teaching GREAT to our 7th graders on September 10th and he also attended the Stonybrook School field trip on September 27th.

Narcotics Strike Force

During the month of September, the Task Force Officer conducted several narcotics investigations in North Plainfield, including numerous controlled purchases of narcotics and various surveillance. These purchases occurred on September 6th & 12th. A search warrant was also executed at a residence located on Duer Street during the month of September. The Task Force Officer attended Top Gun training from September 13th through the 20th.

Other Matters

Detectives investigated two (2) licensing/background applications during the month of September, (1- Liquor license, and 1-Firearms license). Det. Segeda attended monthly Dive Team training which was held on September 13th. Detectives attended mandatory firearms training and Use of Force training on both September 16th & 20th. Officers proudly attended the September 11th memorial which is always held outside of the police department.

Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

Det. Mazza appeared in Grand Jury on September 18th and Det. Everett attended on September 11th. Lt. McKay registered two Megan's Law offenders during the month of September. Det. Everett testified in a weeklong trial that ended in a hung jury. The case will be re-tried in the near future by the Prosecutor's Office.

Damien Brown was sentenced to one year of probation by Judge Cawtherak. Felix Pena was sentenced to five years probation for burglary offenses by Judge Cawtherak. Heather Bachmann was sentenced to five years of probation by Judge Tober for a CDS offense. Santos Rubios was sentenced to 364 days in the County Jail by Judge Cawtherak. Harpreet Singh was sentenced to two years probation and was ordered to pay \$2500.00 in restitution.
