PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Borough of North Plainfield Zoning Board of Adjustment will hold a virtual public hearing at a special meeting of the Board on April 29, 2020 at 7:00 PM to review and take formal action upon an application for preliminary and final major site plan approval, use variance, conditional use variance, bulk variance and design waiver/exception relief by 7-Eleven, Inc. with respect to property having a street address of 1023 Route 22 West, North Plainfield, New Jersey 07060, and being designated as Block 204, Lot 3 on the Borough of North Plainfield Tax Map (the "Property"). The Property is located in the B-4 Zoning District. The Applicant seeks approval to demolish the existing retail store and to construct a single-story structure consisting of an approximately 2,999 sq.ft. 7-Eleven retail store and approximately 994 sq.ft. of office space, along with a gas/fueling station consisting of six (6) pumps, 12 fueling positions, a kiosk and a canopy, as well as other related site improvements
